This is an exciting opportunity to work as part of a dynamic team for the Together project funded by the Big Lottery Fund. The aim of the project is to engage high risk groups from the Tameside area in order to support them decrease their risk (suicide & self-harm) and increase their wellbeing and confidence through connectivity with the community, undertaking of wellbeing activities and gaining training and recognised qualifications. This will mostly be men and women aged 18-55 who are unemployed, facing redundancy or in unstable employment, people with debt, drug or alcohol problems, people with a history of self-harm and people experiencing housing or relationship crises.

The role of Health and Social Care apprentice involves working alongside the project manager and coordinator to assist with the responsibilities for client caseload management, service delivery, and admin duties. This includes one to one client project induction work, assisting in the delivery of Therapeutic group/one off sessions, and the capturing and recording of data in regards to the projects KPI's. The post holder will work alongside the Together Project Manager and Coordinator, Client Services, Adult services, and Community Partners, to assist with the implementation of services within the local area. This post will be situated at TOG Mind's offices based in Ashton, as well as community settings across Tameside, Oldham and Glossop

This post involves working as part of the Adult and Communities team of Tameside Oldham and Glossop Mind, including Targeted Services, Community Early Intervention the Training Academy, and the Topaz Cafe. You will be actively involved in the development of the service and the best way marginalised communities can have the access to mental health services that can have a positive impact on their wellbeing. The key aspect of this diverse post is to ensure that vulnerable Tameside residents are fairly represented and supported whilst accessing services to reach recovery criteria.
